

**KENT COUNTY PROBATE COURT  
INSTRUCTIONS FOR NAME CHANGES  
\*\*CONFIDENTIAL RECORD\*\***

All forms must be typed or clearly printed in ink. The Probate Court will not accept forms for filing unless they are accurate, complete, and legible. If you have legal questions about this procedure, or are unable to properly complete the following forms, you should seek assistance from a qualified attorney. This packet should only be used if you can demonstrate good cause not to publish notice of your name change proceedings. All other name change requests should be processed using Form PC 51. Laws and rules regarding name changes are found at MCL 711.1 to 711.3, and in MCR 3.613.

**CHECKLIST FOR PETITIONER**

- [ ] Applicant has been a resident of Kent County for a minimum of 12 months immediately preceding the filing of the petition.
- [ ] The **Petition to Change Name**, form PC 51c, is completed and signed.
- [ ] An **Addendum to Protected Personal Identifying Information** [MC 97a](#) is completed with name and date of birth for each individual whose name is being changed.
- [ ] Proposed **Order Regarding Ex Parte Request for Nonpublication and Confidential Record**, form PC 161, is completed.
- [ ] **Filing Fee** - \$187.00 (cash, check or money order), payable to the *Kent County Probate Court*. The filing fee includes the cost of one certified copy.
- [ ] **Additional Certified Copy of Order to Change Name (Optional)** - \$12.00 per copy (cash, check or money order), payable to *Kent County Probate Court*.
- [ ] **Fingerprint Card/Background Check** (Adults aged 22+) – Each law enforcement agency charges a unique fee, so the cost will vary depending on where a background check is obtained. (See additional instructions below).
- [ ] A **Self-Addressed Stamped Envelope**.

**ADDITIONAL CHECKLIST FOR MINORS**

- [ ] **Birth Certificate** – A copy of the original birth certificate of the minor is attached.
- [ ] **Child Support Payment History** – If both parents have not signed the Petition and the custodial parent filing the Petition claims that a support order has been entered and the noncustodial parent has failed to substantially comply with the support order for a period of two years or more before the filing of the Petition, then a Child Support Payment History must be obtained from the Friend of the Court and filed along with the Petition.
- [ ] **Non-Custodial Parent** - If the non-custodial parent of a minor for whom name change is sought has not signed the consent portion of the Petition and if the address of the non-custodial parent:
  - is **known**, then along with your Petition, provide the Court with a **stamped envelope addressed to the non-custodial parent** with the return address shown as: Kent County Probate Court, 180 Ottawa NW, Suite 2500, Grand Rapids, MI 49503. The Court will use the envelope to send copies of the Petition and Notice to the non-custodial parent.
  - is **not known and cannot be ascertained after diligent inquiry**, complete **Publication of Notice of Hearing Regarding Petition for Name Change (Noncustodial Parent)**, Form PC 50c. **Additional publication fee of \$110.95 (subject to change) payable to the GR Legal News will be incurred.**
- [ ] **Minor's Consent to Name Change** – If the minor is 14 years or older at the time of the hearing, he or she must attend the hearing, and must sign the Minor's Consent to Name Change, form [PC 51b](#), in the presence of the Judge or Probate Register during the hearing.



## GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT CONFIDENTIAL NAME CHANGES

**Scheduling the Hearing:** Hearings are generally scheduled at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. If the request for nonpublication and confidential record has been granted and all required paperwork and background checks have been received, a hearing will be scheduled by the Court.

**Criminal History Report:** If the person who is seeking to change his or her name is age 22 years or older, the Court will provide a copy of the Petition to the petitioner after it is filed. The individual seeking to change his or her name must go to a local police agency and have his or her fingerprints taken. After fingerprints are taken, the individual must mail a copy of the Petition, the fingerprint card, and the appropriate fee to the Michigan State Police. The fee must be payable to the State of Michigan and mailed to: Michigan State Police, Criminal Justice Information Center – Criminal History, PO Box 30266, Lansing, MI 48909. When the Court receives the required criminal history reports back from the State Police, the Court will schedule the hearing.

**Payment of Publication Fee:** Contact the Grand Rapids Legal News to arrange for payment of the publication fee as soon as possible. Contact information for the Grand Rapids Legal News is: 1430 Monroe Ave NW, Suite 140, Grand Rapids, MI 49505, (616) 454-9293. The Grand Rapids Legal News requires payment prior to publication. Failure to timely pay the publication fee may result in cancellation or adjournment of your hearing. Publication must be made at least 14 days prior to your scheduled hearing date.

**Additional Certified Copies:** One certified copy of the Order Following Hearing on Petition to Change Name will be provided to the petitioner. Additional certified copies may be requested in person at the Probate Court Clerk's office, 180 Ottawa, NW, Suite 2500, Grand Rapids, MI 49503, or via mail. If an Order has been entered granting the request for nonpublication and confidential record, ID or notarized request will be required, and copies may only be released to those individuals entitled to a copy by law.

**Obtaining a New Birth Certificate:** If you were born in Michigan and wish to obtain a new birth certificate from the Michigan Vital Records department showing the new name, you must file an [Application to Correct or Change a Michigan Birth Record](#), (form DCH-0847). The current fee to obtain an amended birth certificate is \$50.00, payable to the State of Michigan. You will be required to send a certified copy of your Order along with the completed form and fee. If you were not born in Michigan, you will need to consult the specific requirements of the state in which you were born.
